

DATA PRIVACY POLICY & NOTICE

1. **Introduction.** Personal data is protected by law. Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd is committed to protecting your personal information. This privacy notice will inform you as to how we look after your personal information, when you visit our website and what you can expect us to do when we collect personal information. It also will tell you about your privacy rights and how the General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR) protects you. Data Protection laws state that companies and organisations can use personal information **only** if they have a proper reason to do so and with consent from the individual. 2. **What and Why we collect Personal Information.** Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd collects and processes personal data only when absolutely necessary and only to fulfil the following requirements.
 - a. To fulfil a contract, we have with our clients, suppliers, subcontractors, potential new and existing Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd staff and any other interested parties.
 - b. When it is our legal duty.
 - c. When it is in our legitimate interest.
 - d. Only when you consent to Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd collecting the data.

3. The table below shows what we use personal information for and the reason we do so. The table also shows what Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd legitimate interests are for collecting the personal data.

4. **Where and how we collect personal information.** Here is a list of all the ways that we collect and how we process your personal information.
- a. Data you give to us:
- (1) When you talk to us on the phone.
 - (2) Visit any of our offices or project sites. (Site Induction)
 - (3) When you provide a business card with company and work contact information.
 - (4) Information provided in contracts between client and Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd.
 - (5) **People who call head office.** When you call Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd we only collect the name e-mail and contact number of the caller to help us in responding to the call to ensure the call is answered promptly and to help Jones Bros improve its efficiency and effectiveness.
 - (6) Customers who visit our Cambrian Sites to purchase concrete or aggregates may be asked to complete a new client form and provide proof of identity. Your data will be processed by authorised Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd employees and stored securely with access control on the company document management system. The WorldPay system is utilised at Bryncir Quarry, and customer sensitive cardholder information is handled daily. All authorised employees will have read and understood this policy prior to handling sensitive cardholder information, to ensure all information is protected.
 - (7) **People who email us.** Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd uses Microsoft Office Outlook using Transport Layer Security (TLS) to encrypt and protect email traffic. Jones Bros monitors any emails sent to us, including file attachments, for viruses or malicious software. Please be aware that you have a responsibility to ensure that any email you send is within the bounds of the law.
- b. Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd Third-Party Data Processors and data storage:
- (1) **Social networks:** Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd uses the social media platforms [Facebook](#) & [LinkedIn](#) to provide updates on company news and advertise, highlight training and career opportunities at Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd. Our social media pages, such as LinkedIn and Facebook, are monitored by Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd selected staff and a third-party company. They pass any customer queries, questions or complaints onto the most appropriate person in our team, so that we can respond accordingly. Please click on the links to see the privacy policies set by Facebook and LinkedIn.
 - (2) **Website:** Our website is managed and monitored by a third-party company. They use Google Analytics to monitor the use of the website and to monitor the number visitors to the site. Google Analytics is a freemium web analytics service offered by Google that tracks and reports website traffic. When using the website a session cookie is generated, the purpose of which is so that word press knows it is the same user that is browsing the website as they click from one page to another. This session cookie disappears when the user closes their browser window. Please see the section on cookies below.

- (3) **Construction Software Platform:** Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd uses a third-party provider to store and manage data that we have collected from Jones Bros, clients, subcontractors and suppliers to help us to manage and deliver projects, accounts, plant equipment and resources. The information entered into the third-party system is done so by Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd Data Processors. We have in place a written agreement with the third-party supplier confirming that all personal data entered has sufficient security, safeguards, and processes in place to protect all the data entered.
- (4) Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd uses a Short Message Service (SMS) text system to communicate with its employees. This is a third party service provider. The information entered into the third-party system is done so by Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd Data Processors. We have in place a written agreement with the third-party supplier confirming that all personal data entered has sufficient security, safeguards, and processes in place to protect all the data entered.
- (5) **External Communication.** Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd does **not** carry out any direct marketing activities but does carry out external communication with support from a third-party PR company to create content across a range of platforms that engages with industry decision makers and stakeholders, including potential Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd clients. The external communication includes:
- (a) Communicating Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd significant experience and expertise in civil engineering.
 - (b) Preparing and sending press releases targeted at trade, business, and regional publications.
 - (c) Preparing information packs for trade exhibitions, recruiting events and opportunities.
- (6) **Accredited Training Organisations and Colleges.** Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd is an accredited training provider requiring Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd to liaise and work with accredited training organisations and colleges for training assessments and the award of training qualifications to Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd employees.
- (7) **HM Revenue & Customs (HMRC).** Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd provides all accounting and tax information to HMRC as required under UK legislation.
- (8) **Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS).** Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd carries out recruitment events at schools and colleges and is therefore required by UK law to ensure all employees involved with these events have a DBS check carried out.
- (9) **WorldPay.** Jones Bros uses WorldPay to allow payments to be taken for materials supplied to customers who visit our Cambrian Sites to purchase concrete or aggregates products. All Jones Bros employees using the Worldpay system follow this data privacy policy and strict procedures for the protection of customer data.
5. **How long we keep your personal information.** By law Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd must keep basic information about our, Staff, Suppliers, Subcontractors and Clients (including Contact, Identity, Financial and Transaction Data). Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd follows all legal and statutory requirements for the retention periods of personal data. To obtain a

record of what information Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd holds about you or your companies please see and follow the directions below.

6. **CCTV, Camera Systems and Related Recordings.** Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd uses CCTV, security cameras, in-cab cameras, dashcams, AI-enabled camera systems and associated vehicle tracking technology where required to support the safety and security of employees, visitors, contractors, company premises, vehicles, plant, equipment and the wider public. These systems are used for legitimate business purposes, including health and safety, site and premises security, incident investigation, protection of company property, legal and insurance matters, regulatory compliance, audit requirements and the prevention and detection of crime. Camera systems are not used for routine employee monitoring. Access to footage and related data is restricted to authorised personnel only and will only take place where there is a legitimate reason to do so, such as following an incident, safety concern, security matter, audit requirement, legal request or investigation. All recordings will be handled securely, retained only for as long as necessary, and processed in accordance with applicable data protection legislation.

a. **Company CCTV Facility.** Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd operates fixed CCTV and security camera systems at certain company premises and project locations to help provide a safe and secure environment for employees, visitors, contractors and other persons attending site, and to protect company buildings, plant, equipment, vehicles and other property.

(1) The company's fixed CCTV facility records images only. There is no audio recording as part of the general company CCTV facility. CCTV images are not routinely monitored and will only be accessed where there is a legitimate business reason to do so, including security, health and safety, incident investigation, protection of company property, prevention or detection of crime, insurance, legal or regulatory purposes.

(2) Images are retained only for as long as necessary. In normal circumstances, CCTV images will be automatically overwritten or deleted after 31 days. Where footage is required in relation to an incident, investigation, insurance claim, legal matter, regulatory requirement or law enforcement request, it may be retained for a longer period, but only for as long as necessary before being securely deleted.

b. **CITB Health, Safety and Environment Test Recordings.** Where Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd delivers or facilitates the CITB Health, Safety and Environment Test, the person undertaking the test may be recorded by CCTV and audio in accordance with CITB testing and audit requirements. This is separate from the company CCTV facility referred to above, which records images only. The purpose of the CITB recording is to support test integrity, security, quality assurance and audit.

(1) Access to CITB Health, Safety and Environment Test recordings is restricted to authorised personnel only. Recordings are used for audit and test assurance purposes only and are not used for general monitoring.

(2) CITB Health, Safety and Environment Test CCTV and audio recordings are retained for 30 days and are then automatically deleted, unless they are required for an active audit or compliance review, in which case they will be retained only for as long as necessary and then securely deleted.

c. **In-Cab Cameras, AI-Enabled Camera Systems, Vehicle Trackers, and Dashcams in Company Vehicles.**

(1) Jones Bros uses recording in-cab cameras and vehicle trackers in mobile plant, and dashcams as standard in company vehicles not limited to Plant, 4x4s, electric pool cars and fitters' vans. The equipment installed in mobile plant consists of a two-way, forward and driver facing camera with a microphone which does not record audio, together with a vehicle tracker

that continually provides location and speed data. Company road vehicles are fitted with forward-facing dashcams only.

(2) Certain in-cab camera systems are AI-enabled. These systems are designed to detect predefined safety related events or behaviours. They will automatically trigger a notification when such an event is identified not limited to mobile phone usage. Where a notification is generated, a notification will be sent to the Human Resources Department where the footage will be reviewed.

(3) Recordings will only be accessed and reviewed on a **for-cause** basis, such as following an incident, receipt of an AI-generated alert or a report of unsafe behaviours. Any review or investigation will be conducted in accordance with Jones Bros Health & Safety and Employee Handbook and if necessary dealt with in line with the company investigation and disciplinary procedures.

(4) Camera footage and any associated recordings are continuously recorded but are not routinely monitored. Where no incident, alert, or concern is identified, recordings will be automatically deleted after 30 days. Where footage is required for an incident, investigation, insurance claim, legal matter, or regulatory requirement, it will be retained only for as long as necessary to fulfil that purpose and then securely deleted.

(5) Where appropriate and where required by law, Jones Bros may disclose relevant footage and data to law enforcement agencies, regulatory authorities, insurers, or legal advisers. This may be done for the purposes of investigating incidents, complying with legal obligations, or protecting the rights, safety, and interests of our employees and the public.

(6) We remain committed to respecting employee privacy. All recordings are handled securely and in line with applicable data protection legislation and access is restricted to authorised personnel only.

7. **How you can obtain a record of what information/data Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd holds against your name or company.** Jones Bros tries to be as open as it can be in terms of giving people access to their personal information. Individuals and companies can request information about themselves by contacting Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd HR by:

- d. If Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd is confident in your identity then the data access request will be processed.

- e. If Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd is not sure of your identity, a Subject Access Request form will be sent out to you. A subject access request form will be sent to you or a specific company. The form asks for details of the request and for proof of ID before any information can be divulged. The form is to be completed and sent back to Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd at hrdept@jones-bros.com or mailed to the address above.
- f. Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd has 30 days from the date of the data access request to respond with what information is held.
- g. If we do hold information about you we will:
- (1) Give you a description of it;
 - (2) Tell you why we are holding it;
 - (3) Tell you who it could be disclosed to (If any);
 - (4) Any legal retention periods.
 - (5) Let you have a copy of the information in an intelligible and secure form.
8. **What to do if you want us to stop using your personal information?** You have the right to object to our use of your personal information, or to ask us to delete, edit, remove, restrict the use or stop using your personal information if there is no need for us to keep it. This is known as the 'right to object', 'right to erasure', right to rectification or the 'right to be forgotten'. In some cases, information cannot always be deleted for example financial and accounting records that legally need to be kept for a minimum of 6 years.
- a. **How to withdraw your consent.** If you or your company wants to request that information is updated, changed or deleted, you are to contact Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd at hrdept@jones-bros.com or send a letter to the address provided above.
- b. If there is no legal reason for Jones Bros to hold the data, Jones Bros will erase the data subject's personal data without undue delay.
- c. Jones Bros will rectify on request any inaccurate personal data.
- d. Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd has 21 days in which to confirm changes or explain why they cannot make the changes requested.
- e. For any more details please call or e-mail using the contact details above.
9. **WorldPay System.** The Worldpay System highlighted at para 4b (9) is used to take customer card payments for the purchase of concrete or aggregates products. Jones Bros will ensure the following to protect customer data when using the Worldpay system.
- To ensure information security, regular training of employees will be carried out, covering cyber-security and GDPR.
 - A clear desk policy is enforced, with computer screens locked when not in use.
 - No notes on sensitive cardholder information will be taken by authorised or other employees of Jones Bros (authorised employees defined in section 4(a)(6) of this policy).
 - All information security breaches are to be reported as per paragraph 11 and without delay to the individual responsible for incident response locally.
 - All POS & PIN entry devices will be appropriately protected and secured so they cannot be tampered or altered.

- Where there is no need to see the full PAN (Permanent Account Number), it shall be masked when displayed.
- Any data of the cardholder will be restricted to the first 6 and last 4 digits of the cardholder data.
- Any sensitive card data no longer required by Jones Bros/Cambrian will be discarded of in a secure and irrecoverable manner.
- Cardholder information awaiting destruction will be held in a lockable storage container clearly marked 'To Be Shredded', with access to such containers restricted.
- None of the following data will be stored at any time: (Strictly prohibited):
 - (a) The contents of the payment card magnetic stripe (track data) on any media whatsoever;
 - (b) The CVV/CVC on the signature panel on the reverse of payment cards, on any media whatsoever;
 - (c) The PIN or encrypted PIN Block under any circumstance.

10. **Job applicants.** Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd is the data controller for the information you provide during the recruitment and employment process unless otherwise stated. If you have any queries about the process or how we handle your information please contact us at hrdept@jones-bros.com

- a. **What will we do with the information you provide to us?** All the information you provide during the recruitment process will only be used for progressing your application, or to fulfil legal or regulatory requirements if necessary. We will not share any of the information you provide during the recruitment process with any third parties for marketing purposes or store any of your information outside of the European Economic Area. The information you provide will be held securely by us whether the information is in electronic or physical format. We will use the contact details you provide to us to contact you to progress your application. We will use the other information you provide to assess your suitability for the role you have applied for.
- b. **What information do we ask for, and why?** We do not collect more information than we need to fulfil our stated purposes and will not retain it for longer than is necessary. The information we ask for is used to assess your suitability for employment. You don't have to provide what we ask for but it might affect your application if you don't.
- c. **Application stage.** If you apply for a role at Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd, we will either advertise the role directly through our website or occasional use a third-party recruitment agency and your details will be collected on our behalf.
 - (1) We ask you for your personal details including name and contact details. We will also ask you about your previous experience, education, referees and for answers to questions relevant to the role you have applied for. Our HR team and hiring manager will have access to all this information.
 - (2) You will also be asked to provide equal opportunities information. This is not mandatory information if you don't provide it; it will not affect your application. This information will not be made available to any staff outside of our HR management team, including hiring managers, in a way which can identify you. Any information you do provide will be used only to produce and monitor equal opportunities statistics.
- d. **Shortlisting.** Our hiring manager's shortlist applications for interview. They will be provided with your name and contact details if you have provided it.
- e. **Assessments.** We might ask you to participate in assessment days; complete tests or occupational personality profile questionnaires; and/or to attend an interview – or a

combination of these. Information will be generated by you and by us. For example, you might complete a written test or we might take interview notes. This information is held by Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd HR with all information provided secured with strict access control.

f. **Conditional offer.** If we make a conditional offer of employment, we will ask you for information so that we can carry out pre-employment checks. You must successfully complete pre-employment checks to progress to a final offer. We are required to confirm the identity of our staff, their right to work in the United Kingdom and seek assurance as to their trustworthiness, integrity and reliability. You will therefore be required to provide:

- (1) Proof of your identity – you will be asked to attend our office with original documents, we will take copies.
- (2) Proof of your qualifications – you will be asked to attend our office with original documents, we will take copies.
- (3) We may contact your referees, using the details you provide in your application, directly to obtain references.
- (4) We will also ask you to complete a questionnaire about your health. This is to establish your fitness to work.
- (5) If we make a final offer, we will also ask you for the following:
 - (a) Bank details – to process salary payments.
 - (b) Emergency contact details – so we know who to contact in case you have an emergency at work.
- (6) If you are unsuccessful following assessment for the position you have applied for, we may ask if you would like your details to be retained in our talent pool. If you say yes, we would proactively contact you should any further suitable vacancies arise.
- (7) Recruitment Agency. If you use a recruitment agency they will ask you to use an online application system, you will provide the requested information to the recruitment agency that provide this information directly to us.
- (8) If you accept a final offer from us, your personnel records will be held on the Jones Bros secure HR employee records system. This system is secure with strictly controlled access.

11. **Personal Data Breaches.** A 'Security Incident' means any incident (accidental, intentional or deliberate) relating to communications or information processing systems. The incident response plan is to be tested once annually and is available to all relevant staff members. If any personal data breaches occur Jones Bros will without undue delay and, where feasible, not later than 72 hours after having become aware of it, notify the personal data breach to the Information Commissioner's Office. All Jones Bros Staff that become aware of any personal data breach are to contact the HR department immediately.

a. Jones Bros will communicate any personal data breaches to the data subject without undue delay. Providing the following information:

- (1) Provide the name and contact details of Jones Bros contact dealing with the breach
- (2) Provide details of the likely consequences of the personal data breach;

(3) Provide details of the measures taken or proposed to be taken by Jones Bros to address the personal data breach, including, where appropriate, measures to mitigate its possible adverse effects.

b. Jones Bros will keep a record of any recorded personal data breaches and take all remedial actions required.

12. **Changes to this privacy notice.** We keep our privacy notice under regular review. This privacy notice was last updated in November 2025.

Cookies

Use of cookies on the Jones Bros Ruthin (Civil Engineering) Co Ltd website

1. An HTTP cookie (also called web cookie, Internet cookie, browser cookie, or simply cookie) is a small piece of data sent from a website and stored on the user's computer by the user's web browser while the user is browsing. Cookies were designed to be a reliable mechanism for websites to remember information (such as items added in the shopping cart in an online store) or to record the user's browsing activity. (Including clicking particular buttons, logging in, or recording which pages were visited in the past).
2. There are no cookies stored on the user's computer/device when browsing the Jones Bros website. A session cookie is generated, the purpose of which is just so that word press knows it is the same user that is browsing the website as they click from one page to another. This session cookie disappears when the user closes their browser window.
3. The table below explains the cookies we use and why.

The session cookie is stored in temporary memory and is not retained after the browser is closed. Session cookies do not collect information from the user's computer. The PHPSESSID cookie is native to PHP and enables websites to store serialised state data. On the Action website it is used to establish a user session and to pass state data via a temporary cookie, which is commonly referred to as a session cookie. As the PHPSESSID cookie has no timed expiry, it disappears when the website is closed. |
